





#### NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF PARLIAMENTARIANS®

District Six Biennial Conference – June 23-24, 2023 Standing Rules

#### PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

1. The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Conference in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the NAP Bylaws and these Standing Rules.

#### COMMITTEES

2. The District Six Director appoints such committees that were/or necessary for the production and the conduct of the Conference.

#### **REGISTRATION AND SEATING**

3. All persons attending the Conference shall have been previously registered and their registration shall be verified by the Credentials Committee before receiving an identifying badge. Identifying badges must be visible for all workshops, luncheons, the business session and the banquet.

4. Seating for the District Six Voting members shall be at the front of the assembly room during the business session.

#### CREDENTIALS REPORT and QUORUM

5. A report of the Credentials Committee shall be adopted at the beginning of the business session.

6. The quorum for the business session shall be ten members that have been certified and entitled to vote at the District Six Conference. (NAP Bylaws Art. IV,  $\S 2$  (A) (3))

#### APPOINTMENTS

7. The District Six Director shall appoint a Recording Secretary, a Parliamentarian, Sargent-at-Arms, a Tellers Committee, the Time Keepers and the Pages for the business session.8. The District Six Director shall appoint a committee of three (3) to review and approve of the minutes of the business session.

#### MOTIONS AND REPORTS

9. Only NAP District Six members shall be entitled to make motions, debate, and vote. 10. Motions shall be in writing, signed by the member, and shall be taken by a Page to the Recording Secretary.

11. Reports of Association Presidents shall be presented, and a copy shall be made available to Recording Secretary.





#### DEBATE AND VOTING

12. A member wishing to speak shall rise, address the chair, and give name and association.13. No member shall speak more than once to a question, nor longer than two minutes without consent of the assembly.

14. Vote cards may be used for votes requiring a two-thirds vote threshold.

#### NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

15. Nominations for District Six Director shall be made from the floor. Nominations speeches shall be limited to one speech of three minutes and one seconding speech of one minute for each nominee.

16. The Head Teller shall be responsible for the procedures and the conduct of the election.

17. The election may be held using an electronic voting service (if available) or by using paper ballots distributed by the Tellers. A majority vote shall elect. If there is but one nominee for District Director, the Presiding Officer shall declare that sole nominee elected.

18. If the election is held using paper ballots, the ballots and the signed tally sheets shall be placed in a sealed envelope and given to the Recording Secretary, who shall destroy them after the conference adjournment.

#### MISCELLANEOUS

19. All cellular phones and pagers shall be turned off or in silent mode; nor shall recording devices be permitted in the assembly room, other than those officially recording the proceedings of the business meeting.

20. Announcements shall be in writing, signed by the person responsible, and shall be taken by a Page to the Recording Secretary

#### Standing Rules

Upon presentation of the Standing Rules, Alison Wallis, PRP, moved to amend Standing Rule #11 by striking all occurrences of "an external electronic voting service" and insert "zoom polling". The amendment was adopted.

The Standing Rules were adopted as follows:

Meeting Standing Rules

- 1. **Quorum**. A quorum shall be established by the chair or tech team member who has the ability to observe the number of online participating members. The quorum of the Conference shall be ten members entitled to vote at the District Six Conference. (NAP Bylaws Art. IV, § 2 (A) (3)) A continued presence of a quorum shall be presumed unless a member notifies the chair of the lack of a quorum.
- 2. **Technical requirements and malfunctions**. Each attendee is responsible for his or her electronic connection; no action shall be invalidated on the grounds that the loss, or poor quality, of an attendee's individual connection prevented him or her from participating in the meeting or workshop; nor will a refund be granted.
- 3. **Forced disconnections**. The chair may cause or direct the disconnection or muting of an attendee's connection if it is causing undue interference with the meeting.
- 4. **Recordings**. Attendees shall not record any session or workshop unless authorized by the chair.
- 5. Assignment of the floor. To seek recognition by the chair, virtually attending members shall enter into the chat "RTS" (request to speak), their name and state: (i) the purpose for which recognition is being sought; (ii) the intention to speak for or against the motion; or (iii) interrupting motions.
- 6. **Identification of speaker**. When recognized by the chair, members shall state their names and association.
- 7. **Motions submitted in writing**. Members wishing to make a main motion or to offer an amendment, shall put the motion in the chat box **before being recognized**.
- 8. **Display of motions**. Main motions, or the pertinent part of main motions, amendments, and other documents currently before the assembly, shall be displayed, to the extent feasible.
- 9. **Debate**. Only NAP District Six members who are registered for the District Event shall have the right to speak on issues before the assembly. A member may speak no more than twice, for no more than two minutes each time, on a debatable motion.

- 10. **Discussion time**. Total discussion time on each main motion shall be limited to twenty minutes.
- 11. **Voting and balloting**. Only NAP District Six members who are registered for the District Event shall have the right to vote. Votes shall be taken by general consent or by Zoom polling. Ballot votes, if required, shall be taken using Zoom polling. Nominations shall be from the floor and election shall be by ballot at the Conference. If there is but one nominee for District Director, the vote may be *viva voce*.
- 12. **Nominating speeches.** Nominations for District Director shall be limited to one nominating speech of three minutes and one seconding speech of one minute for each nominee.
- 13. **Nominees' speeches**. At the close of nominations, each nominee (or a designee) shall have two minutes for remarks. Nominees shall speak in the order in which they were nominated.
- 14. **Parliamentary Authority.** The rules contained in the current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* shall govern the conference in all cases to which they are not inconsistent with the NAP Bylaws and these Standing Rules.
